On January 6th, the Springdale preschool program expanded. The expansion has allowed our site-based preschool program to add more spaces to all sections of 3, 4 and 5 year olds.



This opportunity was made possible by funding from the GATES Grant the Springdale Elementary School received earlier this year.

There are now two sections of preschool: a 3 year old section and a 4-5 section. The three year old students attend school every Wednesday and Friday from 8:00 - 11:15 and our 4-5 year olds attend school Tuesday through Friday, 8:00 - 11:15. Both sections work on the basic fundamentals children need to be ready for Kindergarten.

communication and goal setting.


This class has allowed the students to become more


As a result of Dave's background and expertise, students can receive the fol-
