#### IT'S ELEMENTARY ... AS IN K-5, WATSON

Springdale Elementary students had the learning opportunity recently of listening to childrens' book author, Kelly Milner Halls, a Spokane native best known for several

popular childrens' books, including "Dinosaur Parade," "Hatchlings," "Wild Horses," "In Search of Sasquatch" and many others. In preparation for her visit, teachers read some of these popular books to the students. Ms. Halls talked to students about the history and research into her various books and related traveling adventures. They especially liked examining the fossilized dinosaur droppings and the real-life Sasquatch foot impressions!





Ms. Halls' visit culminated a week of students celebrating "Read Across America" and "Dr. Seuss's Birthday." Teachers and students decorated halls and doorways before reading some of the popular Dr. Seuss books, including, "The Cat in the Hat Comes Back," "Green Eggs and Ham" and "The Lorax."

The newly re-formed Parent Teacher Organization (PTO) recently met again. They sponsored the Scholastic Book Fair which raises money and books for kids, as well as a "Family Fun Math Night" (both held earlier this month). Also, they will be hosting a teacher appreciation dinner during parent-teacher conferences (March 27-29).

In other news, teachers are being trained in the new Common Core Standards adopted by the state. The PREP Consortium training (March 15) focused on various aspects of teaching to the new standards with the goal of raising student achievement. Teachers in grades 3-5 participated in a training, "Going Deeper with Common Core Mathematics," recently with the principal at the Educational Service District in Spokane.

Teachers and students continue to practice the new character traits in the "Character Counts" program. Ten students were recognized in February for their outstanding contributions in practicing "Responsibility." Their pictures were taken with the Principal and posted on a bulletin board near the office. Each month, 10 different students are selected as most representative of the character trait for that month.

In light of recent national events, students and teachers recently conducted a "lockdown" practice. Students and teachers practiced seeking cover behind locked classroom doors. In order to avoid scaring any of the younger students, teachers and administrators sought to make this necessary exercise fun for the kids, so much so that Mr. Schell now receives requests to "do the safety dance".
