




Springdale is a cleaner town with less litter following the hard

# **HIGH SCHOOL HAPPENINGS**

Mary Walker High School's CTE (Career and Technical Education) Department has been very busy and is gearing up for some exciting activities.

- The Technology and Industry Department has put their knowledge to work tuning-up and fixing a variety of power equipment for people within the community. Recently, students in this program represented MWHS in Renton, WA. at the State SkillsUSA competition in both Power Equipment Technology and Motorcycle Repair. Brighton Erickson placed 2<sup>nd</sup> in State in the Power Equipment Technology, and Jonathan Jacobsen was the State Champion in Motorcycle Repair, earning himself a trip to Kansas City this Summer for the National Competition as well as an \$8,500.00 scholarship to attend Wyoming Tech next Fall.
- The Business Education Department is working extremely hard to once again develop the HS yearbook while continuing to update curriculum and computers in our business lab.
- Our Family and Consumer Science Department introduced two new classes this year in REAL and Fashion, creating a lot of excitement. Students in this program recently attended the FCCLA State conference; two groups received a gold standard at the State level for their projects, and one earned the right to attend the National Competition in Nashville, TN.
- The Agriculture Education Department has is busy in the greenhouse raising and
  growing plants for the upcoming annual FFA Plant Sale. They also added a new CNC
  Plasma Table in the Shop which will allow students to learn computer-aided design
  using a CAD software program that 'directs' the table in cutting out whatever is



needed. They are also in the final stages of constructing a new state-of-the-art aquaculture system and hope to have it up and running before the end May in order to begin raising fish during the 2013-2014 school year. The system consists of three 1200-gallon tanks and will allow students to raise and process about a 1000 fish per year. This lab will be available to students K-12, and will provide a great learning opportunity in areas of math, science and various other subjects. Some students in this

program will be attending the State FFA competition, competing in Job Interview, Prepared Public Speaking and First Year CDE. Callan Ward will be receiving his State FFA degree, and Mikala Presho will be running for a State FFA office.

We are very proud of our CTE programs and the opportunities they provide for our students. But, most of all, we are excited for and proud of our students - your children, your neighbors, your future leaders! So, come on out to our annual CTE Carnival, Friday, May 30th for excitement and fun activities—our students look forward to, and deserve this time of community spirit.


