Summer Trip Planned For Eight Student Members

On August 20, 2012, students from Mary Walker High School will be traveling to Latacunga, Ecuador to take part in the club's first foreign service trip. The Springdale group will be traveling with members of the Deer Park Rotary Club, which has been their sponsoring Rotary Club. The Springdale Interact Club was founded at Mary Walker High School in 2008 as a community service club and has 30 members currently. Eight members of the Junior Class will be participating in this nine-day trip. The Latacunga Rotary Club has initiated many social projects in a mostly agricultural-based region. The students will be serving as helpers in the pre-school center, which accommodates 200 indigenous pre-school children each week. This project is sponsored by Rotary Clubs and individual donors in the Rotary District 5080. In addition, Hewlett Packard is supplying modern computers for the Day Care Center as a part of the Springdale effort. One of the student's duties will be to take individual pictures of the children, for them to have displayed in their homes, which will be developed using the new HP PhotoSmartTM printer. This trip is the dream of past and present student club members. Our motto has been "Make Dreams Real". In August, the Mary Walker students will travel to Ecuador to do just that! Will There Be A Successful School Levy In Our Future?

Recently in our area, a number of districts ran school levies, only two failed, but they were in district's that ARE in our area. If those two levies fail again, it will be devastating to those students in those two districts. With the cuts that school districts have received in the last three years, , a failed school levy will make what education looks like in those districts substantially different, to say the least.

In one year, the Mary Walker School District will be running a levy replacement. The decision that our community will make, on whether to support our kids' education or to not support our kids' in their education, will be one of the most important decisions this community will make.

The passing of a levy basically says that the Springdale Community supports our children in their educational opportunities. Outside families looking for a place to live, learn and love will look for educationally supportive communities. The communities that do support education will see improved housing growth, business growth and community pride growth. Communities that fail an education levy will not see the growth or opportunity.

So, really, supporting school levies in any community comes down to two things: (1) you either support the community's children and value education, or (2) you don't.
