SCHOOL FACILITIES

Catalog of Unused Real Property

In order to participate in the policy of the state to identify publicly owned land and buildings that may be suitable for the development of low income housing, the board directs the superintendent to identify and catalog real property of the district that is no longer required for school purposes and is suitable for the development of affordable housing for very low income, low income, and moderate income households. The inventory shall include the location, approximate size, and current zoning classification of the property. The initial inventory shall be provided to the state department of community development by November 1, 1993.

By November 1st of each year, beginning in 1994, the superintendent is directed to purge the inventory of real property sites that are no longer available for the development of affordable housing. The inventory revision shall include an updated listing of real property that has become available since the last update. Each update will be provided to the state department of community development.
